Syllabus for M.A in Sanskrit (CBCS)

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS):

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses (Core Courses, Foundational Courses, Elective Courses). The courses can be evaluated following the grading system.

M A in Sanskrit Programme details:

Programme Objectives:

This programme tries to aware students of the holistic approach of Sanskrit literature and as well as the modern studies, researches and approaches towards Sanskrit Studies. There are papers from different disciplines of Sanskrit studies, such as Veda, Literature, Grammar, Philosophy etc. Not only that the programme has comparative studies on western methods of literary theory, and interpretation. In the philosophy section one unit describes western methods of logic. Computational Linguistics is also introduced. Understanding of the idea of the research will be nurtured through the course on writing term paper. Major elective courses will initiate the student in a selected area providing in depth and comprehensive understanding of that area. The main aim of this programme is to train students in a way that they would able to do further research on their respective fields. This programme would also help student to be competent as a next-generation teacher of Sanskrit.

Programme Specific Outcome:

This programme will enable students to have a comprehensive idea of Sanskrit literature. It is expected that the course would form the knowledge and basic skills for the students to take up various teaching assignments and to pursue further research in the field.

Assessment Methods:

In most of the courses, especially in core courses and in major elective courses the medium of instruction in the class primarily will be Sanskrit. The questions will be framed in Sanskrit language with Devanagari script and the medium of answer also will be Sanskrit with Devanagari script. In Linguistics course and in Computational Linguistics course English language will be used as the medium of instructions and the medium of answers and as well as the medium of questions along with Sanskrit. Each Paper is of 50 marks, having 4 credits. In each paper except in the assignment paper 10 marks is kept for Internal Assessment and the end Semester exam would be of 40 marks. Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

Descriptions of Courses

- 1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course. Here there will be two kind of Elective courses, one is major and another is minor. Major elective course would direct students towards specialisation. Minor elective course is to be taken from other departments.
- 3. Foundational courses are to be conducted by university. The course will have internal assessment only. It would be a non-credit course. But candidates are required to obtain as Satisfactory to become eligible for the award of P.G degree.
- 4. In each semester except 3rd semester an assignment work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

<u>Career Opportunities:</u> After completion of MA in Sanskrit students can work as a Sanskrit language teacher in different institutes. They can also apply in different institute as a research assistant. They as also eligible to write NET and SET exam.

SEMESTER - 1

Vedic Studies

Objectives:

The **Rgveda** is one of the four canonical subdivisions of the *Vedas*. The name can be rendered with "Hymns of the Vedas" or "Hymns of Knowledge " the reference is to the verses recited during the ceremonies, different from the *sāmans*, verses sung. In Rgveda we find a collection of hymns, the *Rgveda Saṃhitā*. Sāyaṇācārya was a Sanskrit scholar and an important commentator on the Vedas, Sayana was a Sanskrit-language writer and commentator. His major work is his *Vedartha Prakasha* (literally, "the meaning of the Vedas made manifest"), or commentary on the Vedas. His continues to be one of the six commentaries on the Vedas that modern day Vedic scholars read. Nirukta (etymological Interpretation) is one of the six Vedānga disciplines of Hinduism, treating etymology, particularly of obscure words, especially those occurring in the Vedas. The discipline is traditionally attributed to Yāska, an ancient Sanskrit etymologist.

Yāska's association with the discipline is so great that he is also referred to as Niruktakāra . In practical use, nirukta consists of brief rules (sūtras) for deriving word meanings, supplemented with glossaries of difficult or rare Vedicwords. Nirukta is also the name given to a celebrated commentary by Yāska on the Nighantu, an even older glossary (dated before 14th Century CE) which was already traditional in his time. Yāska's Nirukta contains a treatise

on etymology, and deals with various attempts to interpret the many difficult Vedic words in the Nighantu. It is in the form of explanations of words, and is the basis for later lexicons and dictionaries.

Course Learning Outcome:

This course is designed to aware the students with Vedic Hymes and Etymology of words, so that they can understand the meaning of Veda

Objectives: This course initiate three schools of Indian Philosophy. The *kārikavali-Muktāvali* of *Viswanatha Panchanana* is a popular manual of the *Nyāya-Vaisesika* System. This text is divided into five section, viz. *Pratyaksha-khanda, Anumāna-khanda, Upamāna-khanda, Sabda-khanda*, and *Guna-khanda*. *Sāṃkhya* is one of the six āstika schools of Indian philosophy. It is most related to the Yoga school of Indian Philosophy and it was influential on other schools of Indian philosophy. Sāṃkhyakārikā of Ishvarkrisna is a popular text in Saṃkhya school.

Course Learning outcomes:

This course aims to introduce the application methods and techniques of Navya Ny \bar{a} ya language among the students. The objective of the course is also to enrich the concept of different views on the precise form of fruition of Mangala, Causality, and three types of causes, nine substances and perception.

Objectives:

This course has been designed as introductory course on Sanskrit rhetoric. The course consists of two texts. The first one is $K \square vyaprak \square *\alpha$, a celebrated work on Poetics, attributed to Mammata, the rhetorician from 11^{th} century Kashmir. The text written in 10 chapters attempts to synthesise the doctrines of the different schools of Sanskrit rhetoric and finally establishes the doctrines of the Dhvani school. The second text, Da*arupakam, is a renowned work of Dhananjay in the field of Dramaturgy after Bharat $N \square tya *\square transfer to the end, sandhis in Sanskrit drama such as the conception of the five elaborated, the means to the end, sandhis in Sanskrit Drama and the Rasa theory.$

<u>Course Learning Outcomes:</u> This course would aware students about the different forms of the literary theory such as *Dhvani*, *Rasa*, *Alamkar* etc. This course aims to make the students understand the techniques of Drama through the help of these important books.

SNSK 201C

The **Atharva Veda** is the "knowledge storehouse of *atharvāṇas*, the procedures for everyday life". The text is the fourth Veda, but has been a late addition to the Vedic scriptures of Hinduism.

In contrast to the 'hieratic religion' of the other three Vedas, the Atharvaveda is said to represent a 'popular religion', incorporating not only formulas for magic, but also the daily rituals for initiation into learning (*upanayana*), marriage and funerals. Royal rituals and the duties of the court priests are also included in the Atharvaveda. Ayurveda, the traditional system of medicine in ancient India. **Varuna** is a Vedic deity associated initially with the sky, later also with the seas as well as Rta (justice) and Satya (truth). He is found in the oldest layer of Vedic literature of Hinduism,. The **Yajurveda** is the Veda primarily of prose mantras for worship rituals. An ancient Vedic Sanskrit text, it is a compilation of ritual offering formulas that were said by a priest while an individual performed ritual actions such as those before the yajna fire. Yajurveda is one of the four Vedas, and one of the scriptures of Hinduism. The exact century of Yajurveda's composition is unknown, and estimated by scholars to be around 1200 to 1000 BCE, contemporaneous with Samaveda and Atharvaveda.

The Yajurveda is broadly grouped into two – the "black" or "dark"(*Krishna*) Yajurveda and the "white" or "bright"(*Shukla*) Yajurveda. The term "black" implies "the un-arranged, unclear, motley collection" of verses in Yajurveda, in contrast to the "white" which implies the "well arranged, clear" Yajurveda. The black Yajurveda has survived in four recensions, while two recensions of white Yajurveda have survived into the modern times.

The earliest and most ancient layer of Yajurveda samhita includes about 1,875 verses, that are distinct yet borrow and build upon the foundation of verses in Rigveda. The middle layer

includes the Satapatha Brahmana, one of the largest Brahmana texts in the Vedic collection. The youngest layer of Yajurveda text includes the largest collection of primary Upanishads, influential to various schools of Hindu philosophy. These include the Brihadaranyaka Upanishad, the Isha Upanishad, the Taittiriya Upanishad, the Katha Upanishad, the Shvetashvatara Upanishad and the Maitri Upa.
