Internship Syllabus for Undergraduate Programme in Sanskrit According to NEP 2020

Course Title: Internship Paper

Overview: The internship programme is designed to provide students with practical experience and exposure to various aspects of Sanskrit studies and research. This program is an integral part of the undergraduate program in Sanskrit, aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

Objectives:

1. Enhance employability skills of students through practical experience.
2. Develop research aptitude and critical thinking skills in students.
3. Provide students with hands-on experience in Sanskrit language, literature, and culture.
4. Equip students with skills to work independently and in teams.

Outcomes:

Internship for Enhancing Employability

1. Students will develop confidence and coordination skills to work in teams.
2. Students will acquire knowledge of ethical values and their application in professional settings.
3. Students will be trained to create online Sanskrit courses, videos, lectures, and podcasts.
4. Students will learn translation services, publishing, and event management skills.
5. Students will develop skills to launch podcasts, create Sanskrit language apps, and develop research projects.

Internship for Developing Research Aptitude

1. Students will develop critical thinking, analysis, and problem-solving skills.
2. Students will learn scientific methods to conduct research in Sanskrit language and literature.
3. Students will gain knowledge of surveys, questionnaires, and data collection methods.
4. Students will develop skills to investigate acoustic properties of Sanskrit sounds and analyze Sanskrit literature.
5. Students will learn to conduct ethnographic research, prepare bibliographies, and communicate research findings effectively.

Overall Outcomes:

1. Students will develop a comprehensive understanding of Sanskrit language, literature, and culture.
2. Students will acquire practical skills to enhance their employability and research aptitude.
3. Students will develop critical thinking, analysis, and problem-solving skills.
4. Students will learn to work independently and in teams, and communicate research findings effectively.

Students can undergo internships at reputed Indic resource centres, including:

1. Internship Categories:

1.1 Internship for enhancing the employability:

- The students may be engaged in any institution (as mentioned above) to develop their confidence for future work.
- The students may be trained to build a sense of coordination in a team to achieve success in doing different types of project work.
- The students may be called on to attend workshop at their colleges to acquire the knowledge of ethical values to fabricate unthreatened future.
- The students may be coached for – online Sanskrit course: create video, lectures, Podcasts, teaching Sanskrit language, literature and culture.
- College can provide translation services for individuals or businesses needing Sanskrit – to – English or Sanskrit – to Sanskrit translation.
- The students may be trained to establish a publishing house focused on Sanskrit literature including books, journals and magazines.
- The students may be trained to organize cultural events such as Sanskrit concert, dance, lectures, show casing Sanskrit literature and culture.
- The students may be trained to launch a podcast discussing various aspect of Sanskrit languages, literature and culture.
- The students may be trained to develop a Sanskrit language mobile app.
- Computational Sanskrit, workshop for providing trainings and learning of programming language.
- Organizing workshops to enhance employability (Army, News Reading Museums, etc.)

1.2 Internship for developing the research aptitude:

The students may be upskilled by providing training in:

- experimentation and data collection and critical thinking, analysis and problem-solving skill.
- applying scientific methods to do research in Sanskrit language and literature to gain deeper understanding of the subject.
- gathering knowledge of surveys and questionnaires.
- investigating the acoustic properties of Sanskrit sounds (phonetic experiments) exploring how they differ from other language.
- gathering the influence of Sanskrit on other languages, such as Hindi, Bengali or Tamil.

- applying qualitative method to analyze Sanskrit literature, such as counting meter patterns or analyzing word frequencies for future research.
- investigating the historical context of Sanskrit texts, using archaeological, epigraphic or numismatic evidence.
- analyzing Sanskrit texts using tools like concordances, dictionaries or digital libraries.
- conducting ethnographic research designing test hypothesis.
- preparing a bibliography or several citation styles for future research.
- assembling work experience with Peers, mentors or experts from other disciplines to ensure methodological rigor and validity.
- keeping detailed records of research design, methods and findings.
- achieving the technique of communication research findings through presentations using clear and accessible language.

The students should be given a comprehensive guide for accomplishing their goal and success.

Duties of Internship:

During the internship, students are expected to:

- Observe and participate in the activities of the resource centre. / Different types of training programme provided by the colleges.
- Arranged seminar and presentation programme to communicate acquired knowledge, observation, insights, skills, work experience on a relevance topic.
- Prepare a report or research article based on internship experience.
- Obtain a certificate from the concerned authority upon completion of the internship.

Assessment:

The internship programme will be assessed based on:

- The quality of the report or research article submitted by the student.
- The certificate obtained from the concerned authority.
- The student's participation and engagement during the internship program.

By completing this internship programme, students will gain valuable practical experience and skills and can prepare themselves for a successful career in Sanskrit studies and research.
